The New York City Automated City Register Information System ("ACRIS") has established a Notice of Recorded Document System which is intended to provide notice to property owners when deeds, mortgages and related documents affecting an ownership interest in real property has been recorded against such property in any of the five (5) boroughs of New York City. This system should not be used to register cooperative apartments. Property owners, their agents including their children and spouse or domestic partners, managing agents and attorneys are permitted to be registered to receive notice.

In order to register in the Notice of Recorded Document System proceed to www.nyc.gov/acris and go to the "Recorded Document Notification Online Application" link which will open to the Notice of Recorded Document page.

Provide the following information requested:

- a) Enter the address or borough, block and lot of the property.
- b) Click on "Notification Options" and provide the registrant's information.
- c) Enter the email address twice.

After these steps you should receive an email confirmation and a sample email notification.
